<p>William Steel</p>		<p>Encouraged the use of a disinfectant for typhus before disinfectants were widely used, and researched into the health of needle workers.</p>
<p>James Johnstone</p>		<p>Concerned about the health of Worcester's population and wrote books to educate ordinary people about preventing illness.</p>
<p>Charles Hastings</p>		<p>A member of the British Medical Association who negotiated with the Government about the creation of the NHS</p>
<p>William Strange</p>		<p>Campaigned for greater public health provisions and founded the Provincial Medical and Surgical Association.</p>
