WHAT IS THIS?

This is a bar of carbolic soap, it is an antiseptic soap made from carbolic acid. Soap like this plaued a pivotal role in the health of soldiers in the Crimean War.

There were many failings of the British Army during the Crimean War, medical care for injured soldiers was one of them. Florence Nightingale became aware of the terrible conditions that injured soldiers were living in and went, with many other female nurses, to look after the soldiers. The nurses insisted on routine handwashing and cleaning of the hospital, 30 tons of soap was sent to them to help them enforce this. These and other improvements in hygiene cut the death rate from 42% to 2%.
